Joy of Giving Week 2011

Bangalore Cares co-ordinated two major events: first, a Charity Bazaar at ITPL, sponsored by First American (India), where in 5 days, 14 NGOs displayed their products and generated over Rs. 4 lakh. Second, SAP Labs India, conducted collection drive for food grains, notebooks, and stationery. Bangalore Cares gathered the material and helped with its distribution – 22 NGOs received materials up to a total value of almost Rs. 6 lakh.



Namma Bengaluru Foundation

We partnered with the Namma Bengaluru Awards 2011 to assist the awardees from the social sector. 'For example, we helped NBA awardee Mr. Uday Vijayan, who started Beyond Carlton, to register their trust and participate for the first time, in the World 10K run to increase awareness about their organisation.

For the past few years, we have assisted the Rotary Club of Bangalore, with the ground work of collecting data, shortlisting and evaluating NGOs, to select the awardee.

TCS World 10K 2012 – a great (fundraising) event

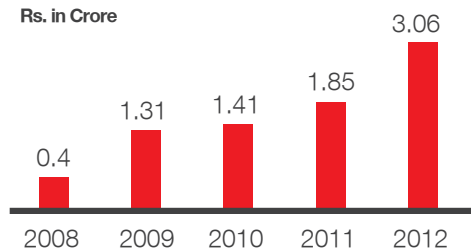
In this report we have include the World 10K run in May 2012, because preparations began in December 2011



This year **84** NGOs participated; a remarkable 65% growth in income for NGOs. The income increased from Rs. 1.85 crore in 2011 to Rs. 3.06 crore this year.

Average funds raised by NGOs who participated in the event has risen from Rs. 1.14 lakh in 2008 to Rs. **4.55 lakh** this year.

The average donation size has grown from Rs. 1,054 to Rs. **2,400.**



Growth of funds raised by NGOs since the event began in 2008

400% increase in online giving from the 2011 run. Online giving will grow and grow...

Rs. **31 lakh** raised by 11 first-time fundraisers after Bangalore Cares fundraising training.

Care Champions are individuals who commit to raise at least Rs. 1 lakh for their chosen NGO. This year, 29 Care Champions raised Rs. 96 lakh – up by **139%** from last year!

5 first-time NGOs raised between Rs. 5 and 10 lakh each.

More and more individual fundraisers from the corporate sector tried fundraising and gave positive feedbacks of wanting to do it again. We look forward to their contribution increasing next year.

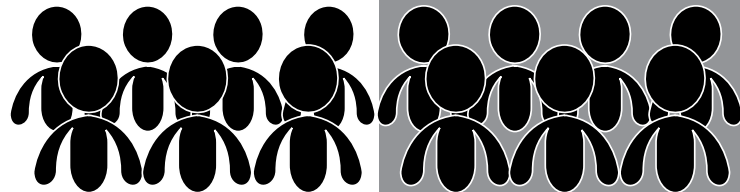

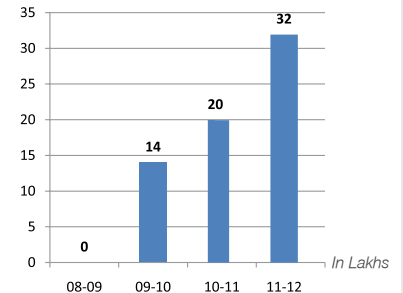
